A large crowd gathered to watch the attempt. The would-be entertainer addressed the crowd: "Who really believes I can do this?" Just one man raised his hand. Right, get in the barrow" said the other. I don't know the outcome or even if it's a true story, but we also have been invited to believe the impossible.

Just two weeks ago we were celebrating Easter and Our Lord's resurrection. Now put up your hand if you truly believe that Jesus was raised from the dead and is now alive. I hope all hands were raised to say "yes", you do truly believe.
