One thing that I really love doing is browsing in second hand book shops. If you've ever been to Hay on Wye, you will know that it is a haven for this kind of thing. Bookshop after bookshop . . . rows and rows of books on every subject.

There was once a man who just loved old books. He spent hours searching in bookshops and auctions, and the walls of his house were lined with bookcases,



containing ancient old tomes in lovely old bindings. His knowledge on old books was second to none.

One day, he was chatting to an acquaintance, who just happened to mention that he had been clearing out the attic of his ancestral home and had thrown out a dust-covered old Bible he found that had been sitting there for generations. "I couldn't read it", the man explained. "Somebody named Guten-omething-or-other had printed it." "Not Gutenberg!" the book lover cried in horror. "That Bible was one of the first books every printed. Why, a copy sold recently for well over a million pounds!" His friend was unimpressed. "Mine wouldn't have even been worth 50p. Some chap called Martin Luther had scribbled all over it in German."

It is possible, is it not, to discard something of great worth, not appreciating its true value. But quite aside from the rarity value of that particular Bible, the true worth of what is contained within the pages of each and every copy of this incredible book is of immeasurably more value to our life, our wellbeing, our future, than we can ever begin to fathom . . . if we read it.

The Bible is the best-selling book in the world. Research conducted by the British and Foreign Bible Society in 2021 suggests that the total number of copies ever sold probably lies between 5 and 7 billion. Thankfully, we can buy this amazing book in this day and age for just a few pounds (as few as two or three pounds in a charity book shop). But let's never lose sight of just how precious, how priceless it is!
