Dear Friends

"Communication"

After taking a service at Hillbrow Care Home, we were chatting with the residents and they told us about some unusual visitors they'd had! Alpacas in the lounge! They'd come from the Woolley



Animals Farm at Winkleigh and were reportedly very sweet natured and soft to the touch, but what I think the residents found most intriguing and rather surprising was the humming sound they made. It's their means of communication. While the alpacas were separately befriending people at either end of the lounge, they would hum to each other for reassurance, as if to say: "It's OK, I'm not far away, just over here".

It reminded me of another form of animal communication, this time between horses. As an instructor with Riding for the Disabled, I was required to take the British Horse Society Road Safety test. A group of four of us gathered one evening for our final assessment and had to ride down the road one at a time. I was on a lovely Fell pony called Storm and, as I nudged him forwards, I could feel a slight reluctance when he realised none of his friends were accompanying him. With stronger use of my legs I got him to set off, but we hadn't gone far when the whinnying started! Really loudly! Reverberating through his whole body – and mine. Horses don't usually neigh or whinny when out in a group but, now on his own, it was Storm's way of keeping in touch with the others back at base. He was probably saying something like: "Don't go away, I'll be back soon".

There are occasions, I'm sure, when we need God's assurance that He is there, that we are not alone. Many verses in the Bible provide just such reassurance. God's word to Joshua, for example: "Be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." And the wonderfully reassuring words of Jesus in Matthew 28:20 - "Be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

The final verse of the hymn 'O Jesus I have promised' makes a great prayer, the two way communication of speaking and listening to God:

"Oh, let me hear Thee speaking, In accents clear and still, Above the storms of passion, The murmurs of self-will; Oh, speak to reassure me, To hasten, or control; Oh, speak, and make me listen, Thou Guardian of my soul." Hilary
