Dear Friends

Psalm 118

The book of Psalms was the 'Singing the Faith' of ancient Israel and it is likely that this Psalm would have been sung as people entered the Temple during the festival of Passover. These words would have been on their lips as they prepared to celebrate God's great deliverance, of God working wonders by His outstretched arm before an enslaved and weary people. This is an important psalm for us too, especially as we journey towards Holy Week and prepare to celebrate Easter. We too celebrate a great deliverance (from sin and separation from God) and we stand in awe at the sacrifice which made it possible. We acknowledge the sun and brokenness (ours and the world's) which led Jesus to the cross, but we also give thanks for the liberation and hope which flowed from it.

The world is in a precarious state. We watch the news and we are tempted to fear for the future. There is, however, a flip side to this. Many have noted the stirrings of something in this country, the first flutterings of a renewed interest in the Christian faith and what it might mean. Jesus died for everyone and everyone stands in desperate need of the salvation and new life which only Jesus can offer. Uncertain times prompt people to look for hope beyond themselves, so let's pray that this is what's happening and that it will bear fruit. Let's pray that more and more people approach the gates of righteousness, with faith in their hearts and songs of joy on their lips. There really is a hope in this world that can never perish, spoil or fade and which the ups and downs of life cannot take away from us. It is a hope which flows, with Jesus' blood, down the cross. It is a hope made real on Good Friday and celebrated on Easter Sunday. Let's never forget this, and let's pray and offer witness to others, so that they might realise it too.
