Dear Friends

A while ago, I'd sent out the Order of Service to our music group and we met in church to practise the hymns. One was StF72 - "Father God I wonder how I managed to exist without the knowledge of your parenthood and your loving care". As that opening line is rather long (!) the title is usually abbreviated to the first four words. In this case there was a small 'typo' where, instead of the 'o' in wonder, an 'a' had been typed, resulting in "Father God I wander".

Our hymn playing got interrupted for a short while as that mis-typed word was pointed out and caused an impromptu rendition of 'The Happy Wanderer' song ("I love to go a- wandering") with some dubious attempts at yodelling for the chorus of "Val-deri, Val-dera," etc. After our foray into frivolity had died down, you'll no doubt be pleased to hear that appropriate decorum was restored for the remainder of our practice!

However, it led me to think about the endless things there are to wonder about. I remember our son, when about 5 years old, rushing in from the garden early one morning, wide-eyed with excitement, urging us to follow him outside, explaining that something amazing had happened overnight. He led us to the old washing up bowl in the flower bed that served as his makeshift wildlife pond and pointed out that what had been a tadpole the previous day had now become a tiny frog. Oh how we marvelled together at this miracle of metamorphosis! On another occasion, less spectacular but no less miraculous, there was more incredulity as first a shoot and then some leaves eventually emerged in a flower pot where he had planted an old conker at the end of the previous season, and which was now proving its potential to become a huge horse chestnut tree.

It reminds me that Jesus encouraged the little children and urged us to be child-like, retaining or rediscovering a sense of wonderment and emulating their simple faith and trust. In times of wondering about things that seem implausible, I'm with the Psalmist who, after acknowledging God who 'knit me together in my mother's womb', admits "such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain" (Psalm 139). I appreciate anew the words of Psalm 8: "When I consider the heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars What is man that you are mindful of him....?"

I would recommend listening to this song (below) which can help us to contemplate the most wonderful love of God in sending Jesus to earth for us. There are some lovely versions online. "I wonder as I wander, out under the sky, how Jesus the Saviour did come for to die, for poor ordinary people like you and like I; I wonder as I wander, out under the sky."
