Dear Friends

A few years ago we went to a village in Dorset called Moreton. We had heard there was a famous window in the parish church. The window showed an etching on the clear glass of Judas with a noose round his neck. Falling from his hand were the 30 pieces of silver, but as they fell they became flowers. The question the picture posed was: "*Can Judas be forgiven?*"

Apparently the local parish council had rejected the window for some years but in the end they relented and the window was installed.

When I asked myself this question I was exactly like a parish council. At first the answer was: "*No, not on your life*" but of course on reflection that was quite wrong. God forgives. And Judas was so remorseful. But another question occurred to me. Should Judas be blamed at all if he was part of God's plan to save the world? Did Judas have any choice?

On reflection I thought Judas had free will and he should be blamed. Jesus had free will, too. God put him on earth to save us and Jesus the man worked out how to do it of his own free will because that was what his Father wanted.

Jesus achieved this miracle to save and redeem us. Even so, in the garden of Gethsemane he asked for the cup to be taken from him. But he knew what he must do and he saw it through.

So rightly we worship him. And we should forgive Judas but hold him to account, like us all.
